



On-street parking is legal in our neighborhood but prohibited in the following locations:

- In such a manner as to leave available less than ten (10) feet of the width of the roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic
- On a sidewalk
- Within an intersection
- Within 30 feet of any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic-control signal (“red light”)
- On or within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection
- On or within 50 feet of a railroad crossing
- Within 20 feet of a fire station entrance or within 15 feet of a fire hydrant
- In front of a public or private driveway
- Next to a vehicle stopped or parked at the edge of a street (“double parking”)
- Any place where official signs prohibit parking or restrict parking to specified days or hours

Further, it is illegal to park a vehicle on the street for the following purposes:

- Displaying the vehicle for sale or displaying other advertising
- Washing, greasing, or repairing the vehicle, except repairs necessitated by sudden emergency

Finally, the following types of vehicles are prohibited from on-street parking in excess of one (1) hour in a residential area:

- any bus, truck or other freight- or passenger-carrying vehicle in excess of one-half-ton capacity or a body more than eight (8) feet wide or a body more ten (10) feet high
- any truck camper, camper trailer, motor home, boat, boat trailer or other recreational vehicle
