- Possibly mixed use
- Once they have plans, he will contact us and come talk to us about the plans
- Will be more like Emory Point
- Won't touch the flood plain, so community garden should not be touched
- Good case scenario is 2 years
- We will put their info on the web site
- They do not own the property fronting N. Druid Hills, so won't be able to make better walking entrance to Mall
- Old Cub Foods shopping center
 - Actually 2 shopping Centers in one
 - The back part, that looks burned out
 - Bought by Good Will.

- The other part owned by someone else
- Trying to get in touch with them, but so far has not. Will let us know once she learns anything

Keep DeKalb Beautiful

- Has been contacted
- Asked to adopt L'ville Hwy from CVS to N.Druid, to Willivee
- We are waiting to hear from them
- Call for Master and other gardeners in the community to help design entrances look beautiful and low maintenance
- We will have to go several times a year to clean once a quarter
